COVID's Impact on Overnight Trips

Earlier this school year, the CG Board of Education approved two overnight student trips that were to occur this spring. The first trip, which was a High School of Business trip to Chicago, was slated for the latter part of March. About a month ago, a vaccine requirement was implemented in Chicago for indoor dining, entertainment, and recreation venues where food or beverages are served. After discussing this with our trip provider, it was decided that it would be best to cancel this trip, as this mandate would have a significant impact on the itinerary for the trip. Students and parents were made aware of this cancellation a couple weeks ago.

The other approved overnight spring trip is the annual eighth grade Washington D.C. trip. We have not been on this trip since the fall of 2019. The trip is still in place at this moment, but Washington D.C. recently implemented a vaccination requirement this is similar to the one approved in Chicago. We are currently working with our trip provider on variations of the current itinerary, in an effort to make this trip happen this spring. At this time, no final decision has been made whether to cancel this trip as well. Our goal will be to have a decision made by the end of January.

We apologize for the inconveniences these changes have caused, as we know students look forward to participating in these trips. We will continue to keep our parents and students informed as decisions are made regarding these trips.
