2024-25 School Closings Update

As of yesterday, we have used five calamity days for the 2024-25 school year, meaning we will make up for any additional calamity days. As we did last year, if we reach a sixth calamity day or beyond this school year, we will first refer to the board-approved 2024-25 school calendar to see if there are any scheduled days remaining that are designated to make up for inperson instruction. There is one pre-scheduled make-up day for in-person instruction on this year's calendar, February 17 (Presidents Day). If we reach a sixth calamity day (or beyond) after February 17, we will make these days up via virtual school days of instruction, with students completing their instruction and assignments online.

One of the biggest benefits of using this approach is that it will eliminate school days getting added to the end of the school year, during a time when families have vacations already planned. If you have any questions about this process, please contact Mr. Verhoff at 659-4301.

Board Approves Installation of Field Turf for Baseball and Softball Diamonds

At last week's January Board of Education Meeting, the Columbus Grove Board of Education approved an agreement with the J. Earl Belch Charitable Trust which will fund a permanent improvement project to install field turf to the infields of the district's softball and baseball diamonds. The Board also approved a Letter of Intent with Maumee Bay Turf Center/Turf Nation, the contractor scheduled to complete this work. This project, estimated at approximately \$556K, will be fully funded by the generous monetary donation of the trust. Please see the Q&A below for more information related to this project.

What is the purpose of this project?

The project aims to enhance the quality and usability of the district's baseball and softball diamonds by installing infield turf. Maintaining baseball and softball infields requires significant time and expense. This upgrade will provide a safer, more durable, and consistent playing surface for athletes, reduce maintenance costs, and allow for extended use during various weather conditions. The turf installation will provide athletes with high-quality facilities and reduce game cancellations, giving students more opportunities to practice and compete.

How is this project being funded?

The project is fully funded by a generous \$600,000 donation from the J. Earl Belch Charitable Trust. The estimated project cost is \$565,000, meaning the donation is projected to cover all expenses without requiring additional district or taxpayer funds.

Why are we prioritizing infield turf installation?

Installing turf addresses several challenges with natural infields, including frequent game cancellations due to weather, uneven playing surfaces, and high maintenance requirements. The turf will create a more reliable and professional-quality playing field for our teams.

Will any taxpayer dollars or school funds be used for this project?

No. This project is entirely funded by the charitable trust's donation, ensuring no financial impact on taxpayers or the district's general fund.

What will happen with the excess funds from the donation, if any are left after the project?

If funds remain after the project is completed, they will be used to maintain the new turf, maximize its lifecycle, or be earmarked for the turf replacement fund.

How were the estimated costs determined?

The \$556,000 estimate was developed through consultation with Maumee Bay Turf. It includes all necessary expenses, such as materials, labor, and turf upkeeping equipment. Maumee Bay is the same company that installed the infield turfs for Kalida Schools.

When will the project begin, and how long will it take?

The timeline for the project will depend on final approvals and contractor availability. Once construction begins, it is expected to take several weeks to complete. Updates will be shared with the community as details are finalized. We are targeting a start date for this summer.

Why not use the funds for other district needs?

The donation is specifically designated for installing infield turf on the baseball and softball diamonds. The district is committed to honoring the wishes of the J. Earl Belch Trust and ensuring the funds are used for their intended purpose.

Will the turf installation affect other district programs or facilities?

No. Since this project is fully funded by the donation, it will not impact the budget or resources allocated to other district programs or facilities.

These synthetic turfs need to be replaced every 10-12 years. How will the district pay for this?

The district receives approximately \$50K per year from the state from casino revenues. In 2012, the Board created a special projects fund for these dollars to pay for various projects as needed. Part of these annual casino dollars will be earmarked to develop a replacement fund for this infield turf. These funds, in coordination with fundraisers conducted by the baseball and softball programs, will be earmarked to replace the original turf. Industry experts estimate the replacement cost for existing turf is about 50% of the original installation.
