CGHS Wrestlers are Back-to-Back NWC Champions!

Last year, the Columbus Grove Wrestling team made school history, as they earned the district's first ever Northwest Conference Wrestling Championship. The Bulldogs made sure fans didn't have to wait quite so long for the next NWC Championship, as the CG Wrestlers won the NWC Championship again last weekend, outpacing second place Allen East by a score of 286.5 to 263. Ohio School Bus Safety Working Group Releases Recommendations

You may have recently heard or read about Governor DeWine's special taskforce releasing a set of recommendations for increased safety on school buses. This taskforce's creation was a result of a student death on a school bus last August in Clark County. Sadly, there was another accident in November involving fatalities of students and staff on a charter bus that was rear-ended on I-70. Both accidents were the result of driver error from the other vehicle, not the bus driver.

There were 17 recommendations from this taskforce, with many of these recommendations including further training for bus drivers. While this may sound reasonable in a theoretical manner, Ohio Bus Driver Standards are already some of the most stringent in the United States, per Joe Dietrich, Northwest Ohio Preservice Bus Driver Instructor. Bus drivers are already required to participate in four hours of professional development annually. Furthermore, the preservice program to become a bus driver is a rigorous process as well. Licensed bus drivers in Ohio are well prepared when they begin driving for schools.

Another recommendation of the taskforce is for the Department of Education and Workforce (DEW) to work with the Ohio General Assembly to develop and fund a grant program to help school districts to invest in school bus safety features. While this will be a financial benefit for school districts if it comes to fruition in the future, Columbus Grove Schools, like many in the state, have already invested in the latest bus safety features to maximize safety both inside and outside of our school buses. The continued improvement of flashing exterior LED lighting on buses is just one example. Furthermore, our district's buses are equipped with multiple interior and exterior cameras, which provides a good deal of help handling student behavior and illegal bus passes.

In my 12 years at Columbus Grove, the biggest safety concern with our buses is the illegal passing of school buses at stops. We have anywhere from 6-10 of these illegal passes in a school year. Sadly, we have seen a number these illegal passes due to the fact that the driver is not paying attention when coming up on a bus stop. The Putnam County Sheriff's Office has worked well with the district in making sure offenders are prosecuted for such infractions, but not having them in the first place would obviously make it safer for everyone involved.

Columbus Grove buses drive an average of 600 miles and transport just over 300 students on a daily basis.

As the data will show, bus transportation is the safest mode of transportation for students to and from school. In the past six years in the state of Ohio, there has been one student fatality involving school bus transportation, while there have been far more school-age children and teenagers killed or injured while riding in a passenger vehicle, walking, or riding a bike. Data from the Ohio State Highway Patrol show that school buses are involved in less than 1% of all crashes in the state. I am happy to say that this statewide data is in direct correlation with our school district's bus safety. Many thanks go to our dedicated bus drivers at Columbus Grove who make student safety a top priority transporting our children to and from school: Deanna Ricker (23 years), Shelly Schroeder (20 years), Linda Ridenour (16 years), Mike Fanaff (14 years), Joanne McKanna (9 years), Janel Hardeman (8 years), Brad Anderson (7 years), Bill Heilman (2 years), Chad McCluer (2 years), Jeff Gertsen (1 year), and Nita Maag (1 year).
