Congratulations, Class of 2024!

Last Sunday, Columbus Grove Schools held its 146th commencement. The Class of 2024 at Columbus Grove concluded their high school careers with a number of accolades, including:

- Our Marching Band, led by seven of our seniors, earned its first "Superior" rating at OMEA State Competition since 2016.
- The boys' Cross-Country team, led by four seniors and two of the district's top 10 Cross Country runners of all time, Luke Ellerbrock and Evan Pitts, led this year's team to our district's first-ever State Cross Country Championship.
- On an individual level, we had a senior wrestler Loudon Auchmuty, who had a 0.0075%, or 1 in 13,000 chance of making it out of the wrestling districts for state competition. Yet, it was Loudon, along with fellow senior Kyle Lathrop, who competed in Columbus at the OHSAA state wrestling tournament this past March.
- Girls' Basketball team qualified for a fourth consecutive regional appearance- the longest streak in school history.
- After winning the district's first-ever NWC Wrestling title in 2023, the CG Wrestling team made it back-toback titles in 2024.
- Both track teams have numerous senior athletes competing for state qualification this week.
- Over 20 graduates earned dozens of credentials at during their two years of training at the Apollo Career Center.
- This senior class consisted of 24 honor graduates.

Columbus Grove Local Schools is accepting applications for substitute bus drivers. This position has the potential of becoming a full-time bus driver in the future if the applicant is interested. Substitute bus drivers are contacted to drive extracurricular and field trips and occasionally drive a regular morning or afternoon route. Certification requires the completion of attending a preservice class, a written and driving test, CDL license, a medical physical exam, drug test, BMV check of driving record, and a background check. Cost for training will be fully reimbursed by the district for any individuals who serve as a substitute bus driver for Columbus Grove Local Schools.
