Congratulations, Class of 2023!

Last Sunday, Columbus Grove Schools held its 145th commencement. The Class of 2023 at Columbus Grove concluded their high school careers with a number of accolades, including:

- Our Marching Band, led by eight of our seniors, earned back-to-back trips to OMEA state competition for the first time in over 5 years.
- The boys' Cross-Country team that lost a good deal of outstanding runners from the prior year's class, followed up with a 6th place finish at the state XC meet this past fall.
- Our Football team reached the state semi-final last fall as well. This senior group is collectively is one of the winningest classes in school history.
- An impressive group of 20 seniors attended Apollo Career Center and earned many credentials and awards.
- Our Girls' soccer team repeated as PCL champions.
- A third consecutive regional appearance by our girls' b-ball team – a first in school history.

Columbus Grove Local Schools is accepting applications for substitute bus drivers. This position has the potential of becoming a full-time bus driver in the future, if the applicant is interested. Substitute bus drivers are contacted to drive extracurricular and field trips and occasionally drive a regular morning or afternoon route. Certification requires the completion of attending a pre-service class, a written and driving test, CDL license, a medical physical exam, drug test, BMV check of driving record, and a background check. Cost for training will be fully reimbursed by the district for any individuals who serve as a substitute bus driver for Columbus Grove Local Schools.
