Update on 2018 CG Alumnus, Geddy Davis

About six years ago, Mr. Schafer's High School Business class began the Bulldog Newscast, which was a 6-8-minute news show that highlighted the events of Columbus Grove Schools and the community. One segment was its weather segment, which was led by then CG student, Geddy Davis. Geddy had a passion for studying weather at a young age, so he was a natural to head up this segment. For a few years, the Bulldog staff and students received their weather updates from Geddy, who worked both behind and in front of the camera.

After Geddy graduated from CGHS in 2018, he followed his passion and studied Atmospheric Science at The Ohio State University, graduating Cum Laude this past spring. Geddy is now working in the Byrd Polar and Climate Research Center at The Ohio State University.

Last month, Geddy was part of a group collecting data for a "head island" project in the City of Columbus. His forecasting led them in choosing him to run the event in the city of Columbus! Geddy was the point person for interviews to represent OSU for the project. Columbus Grove Local Schools is accepting applications for substitute bus drivers. This position has the potential of becoming a full-time bus driver in the future, if the applicant is interested. Substitute bus drivers are contacted to drive extracurricular and field trips and occasionally drive a regular morning or afternoon route. Certification requires the completion of attending a preservice class, a written and driving test, CDL license, a medical physical exam, drug test, BMV check of driving record, and a background check. Cost for training will be reimbursed by the district for any individuals who serve as a substitute bus driver for Columbus Grove Local Schools.
