CG Schools Earn 5-Star Rating on 2023 State Report Card!

Last Thursday, the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) released the 2023 School Report Cards. These report cards have changed a great deal over the years and last year included a number of significant changes, most notably, the elimination of letter grades and the implementation of a 5-star rating system. As ODE stated in its press release, school report cards are only one part of Ohio's education story. There are five categories which schools are rated on this new 5-star rating scale. A 3-star rating means the district met the state standards, 4-star exceeded state standards, and 5-star rating means the district significantly exceeded the state standards. I am happy to report that our district scored at least a 4-star rating in all five categories:

- Achievement: 5 stars (significantly exceeds state standards)
- Progress: 5 stars (significantly exceeds state standards)
- Gap Closing: 5 stars (significantly exceeds state standards)
- Graduation Rate: 5 stars (significantly exceeds state standards)
- Early Literacy: 4 stars (exceeds state standards)
- Overall Rating: 5 stars

Regarding how CG Schools scored compared to the rest of the Putnam County districts:

- CG ranked first in the Putnam County regarding the overall average rating of the five categories.
- CG and Ottoville are the only two districts in the county to earn an overall 5-star rating.
- Like last year, CG is the only district in the county to score at least a "4" in every category.
- Again, CG is the only district in the county to score a "5" in the Progress category. No other district scored higher than a "3" in this category.

We typically do not make a big deal about school report ratings in our district. Our goal is to educate every student who walks through our doors to the best of our ability, no matter what their needs may be. Of all the ratings, I'm proudest of the Progress rating of 5 stars, as it shows how well staff works with every student, no matter what their backgrounds or current circumstances. LCC and Fort Loramie Joining the Northwest Conference in 2024-25

Additionally, LCC's contract to be a full member of the NWC is for four years. At the conclusion of this contract, both parties will determine if they want to continue LCC's membership to the NWC.

Homecoming Parade Planning

- If children are too small to walk the distance to the American Legion by themselves, a student council representative will be available to walk with them.
