Art Teacher Sarah Ricker's drawing students added a pastel chalk mural on the pavement leading up to Clymer Stadium, along with the name of all the numbers of our team with the veteran whose name was on the back of their jersey. This year's event also had a special dedication to a POW/MIA chair that has been installed by the flag pole at Clymer Stadium. VFW 9648 Commander Brian Wolverton and Brian Siefker were present to dedicate the Prisoner of War/Missing in Action Chair. The POW/MIA chair was donated by the Columbus Grove VFW Post 9648 in remembrance of the nearly 81,000 Americans who are still missing in action, from wars and other military conflicts dating back to WWII. Free Reading Tutoring Services Available for Students Grade 2 and Above

The Putnam County ESC, in partnership with the Putnam Educational Foundation, is offering an afterschool program to help students who are below grade level in reading. This is a one-year opportunity funded through the Summer Learning and Afterschool Opportunities Grant Project MORE is an evidence-based reading intervention consisting of 30-minute sessions, 3-4 days per week, with a trained mentor working 1 on 1 focusing on fluency, comprehension and literacy skills. This supplementary support is in addition to school classroom instruction.

Tutoring is available at the Putnam ESC, 124 Putnam Parkway, Ottawa, OH. Tutoring sessions are 30 minutes with a trained tutor in Project MORE. Session One starts Monday, October 2. If you are interested, please contact the ESC at 419-303-5667.

Homecoming Parade Planning

The 2023 CGHS Homecoming Parade will take place next Friday, October 6. The parade will begin at 5:30 p.m. and start from the American Legion. Advance planning to coordinate the parade participants has begun. In an effort to make this process as safe and smooth as possible, a number of guidelines have been set for all participants to follow.

- Floats arrive at the American Legion parking lot prior 4:45 p.m.
- There will be a parade coordinator stationed at the entrance to the American Legion who will direct floats to their designated location.
- Beginning at 4:45 p.m., Plum Street will be blocked off at the intersection with the alley. The traffic will be one way at Plum Street and moving towards the American Legion. Parents with children are asked to enter at Plum Street and drop their children off at the alley intersection before exiting down the alley.
- If children are too small to walk the distance to the American Legion by themselves, a student council representative will be available to walk with them.
