#### **Bulldog Bites:**

The Columbus Grove Football Team held its end of season banquet this past Sunday. CG Football statistician Ned Stechschulte updated his *History of Football: Columbus Grove High School* book for the banquet to include this year's stats. Here are a couple impressive statistics for our fans:

- Earlier this season, Tadd Koch set the record for most career tackles. Tadd ended his career with 433 tackles. The second most career tackles in CG Football history is Andrew Nichols with 317.
- The Bulldogs now have an all-time record of 104-34 at Clymer Stadium.
- Sophomore Trenton Barraza rushed for 1,692 yards this season, which is the third highest single season rushing total in school history. Blaine Maag holds the single season record with 2,703 yards in 2003 and Jeremy Harnishfeger is second with 1,991 yards in 2006.
- Coach Andy Schafer now has a 13-5 playoff record, tying Jerry Cooper (13-4) for first in all-time playoff coaching wins at CG.
